

APCSSLink now live

The long-awaited APCSS portal is now live and ready for use. Formerly known as RIO (or Regional International Outreach), the site allows users to share information, collaborate and even communicate through the network.

The portal takes the place of the old alumni network and also can be used by current Fellows as well as faculty and staff.

Some features of the system include blogging, file sharing, threaded discussions, contact information, special event announcements, email and more. In future versions, the site will offer instant messaging and other communication features.

The portal was unveiled during the Alumni Association Leadership Workshop held at APCSS in July. In addition to receiving basic training on the systems, alumni leaders were also encouraged to use the site to help
